## Issuing a statement on the importance of Colombian President's resolution

Bisan Center, along with the Palestinian NGO Network (PNGO), issued a statement on the escalating humanitarian catastrophe in Gaza, emphasizing the importance of Colombian President Gustavo Petro's "Uniting for Peace" resolution to protect Palestinians from genocide and ethnic cleansing. This comes amid the continued systematic and brutal Israeli attacks against the foundations of life, and the need for a humanitarian response in the Gaza Strip. The statement called on all UN member states to support the "Uniting for Peace" resolution and take immediate and concrete measures to end the genocide.

The lecture will be presented by Professor Edward I. Moser, a neuroscientist and Nobel Laureate, who will explain how recent technological advances allow us to monitor the dynamics of thousands of place and grid cells, and how grid cell dynamics arise in large neuronal populations.

## Implementing an initiative to improve children's mental health in Beit Anan

In cooperation with the Cultural Forum Center in Beit Anan, northwest of Jerusalem, Bisan Center organized an initiative titled "Improving Children's Mental Health." Launched on Monday, September 8, the initiative targeted 200 children aged 4 to 6 and 50 mothers. The initiative provided a training program for parents on how to support children's mental health.

## Providing home gardens with agricultural supplies

During September, Bisan Center provided home gardens in eight villages in Tulkarm Governorate and four villages in Ramallah Governorate with agricultural supplies as part of the Empowerment Through Environmental Agriculture project. This came after the owners of these gardens participated in agroecology training held by the center in several areas of the West Bank, which benefited 100 people.
